


## 1. AMERICAN AND NATIONAL IDENTITY

Students need to be able to explain how various identities, cultures, and values have been preserved or changed in different contexts of U.S. History


 Focus on gender, class, race, and ethnicity, "American" identity, group identity

Students need to be able to examine how various economic and labor systems, technological innovations, and government policies have shaped American society




Students need to be able to examine the factors behind the development of systems of economic exchange, particularly the role of technology, economic markets, and govt

### 6. POLITICS & POWER

Students need to be able to examine debates over the role of the state in society, and its potential as an active agent for
